



### Book Club News





## Your Input Matters!

Likely starting in the middle of January, FLC members will be asked to share their perspectives about the congregation through a Congregation Assessment Tool or CAT. This tool is provided by **Holy Cow Consulting**, whose primary mission is to help churches make data driven decisions. The survey will be offered digitally as well as on paper. It usually takes less than 30 minutes.



The Council is seeking input from the congregation to assess our congregation's vitality compared to a data base of other churches who have already taken the survey. Pastor Lehman stated, "Strong churches conduct surveys and gather information from time to time to get a sense of how their membership perceives the mission and ministry of their churches. It is actually a sign of good health that Church Councils do this. The goal is to help First Lutheran evolve into the best congregation it can be!"

Holy Cow Consulting has served over 3000 congregations for the past 30 years. Thus, the group has a large data base from which to compare and contrast FLC's responses to those of other churches. Their stated mission is to *help church leaders make better decisions in less time with more confidence*. So, the information will help FLC leaders:

- 1) measure the satisfaction and energy levels of the congregation
- 2) Identify issues and concerns that will assist leaders in improving the church's organizational climate
- 3) Identify potential resources that otherwise might be missed
- 4) Provide information about the church's culture and hopes for the future

The Council cordially invites you to participate in this important survey that will affect our church's future!






