Jesus Is Missing You!

A New, Two Month Emphasis For January and February

The Church Council approved a proposal from the Evangelism Committee for the beginning of 2019. The theme of this emphasis is **Welcome Back Home - Jesus Is Missing You!** It will begin on Sunday, January 6 and conclude on Sunday, March 3.

During these two months, our pastors will preach on a variety of topics related to how FLC is not only our home but could be a home for the unchurched in our community. Over 9 weeks, the services will include Faith Talks, skits, videos and special music focusing on how we can share our faith with others.

From February 10 - March 3, the sermons will include themes from the movie, ***I Can Only Imagine***. The church has purchased this movie and will offer it on three separate occasions:

- **Sunday, January 20 @ 2:00 pm**
- **Thursday, January 31 @ 7:00 pm**
- **Tuesday, February 12 @ 7:00 pm**

The movie will be shown in the Fellowship Hall. Free popcorn and beverages will be provided. Everyone is invited to see this powerful, faith-based story that is appropriate for middle-school aged children through adults. A separate, age-appropriate movie will be shown in the Impact 456 Room for smaller children.

In addition, small groups will be forming to discuss and learn more about the themes portrayed in the movie and how they can impact our daily lives. More information will be provided in the new year. If you specific questions, please contact Erlene Bishop Killeen in the church office.

A Few Words From Our Pastors

Dear Friends of First Lutheran Church,

We write this message to you anticipating a new year of faith at our church! 2019 will start a little differently than prior years because the landscape of Christianity is changing in our country. Some futurists even argue that there is an impending crisis for all churches across the nation, but even more for mainline churches like ours. So, we want to start 2019 by encouraging our congregation to try something new! Here's why...



A couple of statistics indicate we need to become a more faith-sharing and welcoming church. Consider:

- In 1988, the inception of the ELCA, total membership was 5.2 million. Now, it is around 3.6 million. That is a loss of 1.6 million members or over 30% in three decades. FLC has declined a bit as well.
- There used to be over 11,000 ELCA churches. Now, there are around 9,000. (Other mainline denominations like Episcopalian, United Church Of Christ, United Methodist, Presbyterian are struggling with even greater losses.) Due to membership and giving losses, another 2,000 ELCA congregations will **not** be able to afford full-time ministry, and many will move into multiple-church ministries soon.

The story is different for other Christian Churches in the US. Take a look at following membership **increases** experienced by these churches from around 1965 - 2013:

- Church Of God In Christ: ↑ 1,194%
- Evangelical Free Church ↑ 749%
- Assemblies Of God ↑ 430%
- Southern Baptist ↑ 46%



These churches are often labeled as “Evangelical” in our culture. They are very concerned about people having a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. So, they strongly encourage their members to share their faith stories as testimonies and participate in adult ministries. Membership is based on this type of commitment rather than simply having one’s name on a membership list and worshipping.

We pastors are concerned that many Lutherans have a strong faith but are inhibited about sharing it with others. We want to reverse the negative trends by helping our congregation become welcoming, inviting and hospitable. Research indicates that this is the best formula for growth!

Towards that end, our Evangelism Committee proposed a two-month emphasis on answering Christ’s call to make disciples as Jesus requested in Matthew 28:19-20a.

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.

The theme for this emphasis is illustrated on the front cover: **Welcome Back Home ~ Jesus Is Missing You!** For more information, *please see page 2.*

This theme may sound a little strange, especially to those of us who have been active members at FLC. But the theme’s name was picked intentionally. The focus is not only for us to be faithful Christians as individuals, within our families and church. It is also to invite those who have been absent to return and connect with others who have no church home at all.

We hope FLC will be a welcoming home, full of hospitality to everyone who needs the **Light that shines in the darkness** whose birth we celebrated at Christmas!




Book Club News


The **Evening Book Club** will meet on Tuesday, January 8 at 7:15 pm. The book to be discussed is **Art Forger** by Barbara Shapiro.

Women Bible Study




