This month we celebrate Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday on the same day! It is rather appropriate isn't it? The best Valentine we ever got was Jesus. God loved us so much that he sent His Son to die for us. John 3:16. It is as simple as that, right? Or not.

During the 40 days of Lent you will have a chance to:



The theme this year is Not Perfect, Just Forgiven. Come and reflect, spend an hour with God and think about how God's love is reflected in forgiveness.

All ya need is Love - God's Love. Explore what that means for you this Lent at FLC.

Council Highlights

At its January meeting, FLC's Council:

- * Expressed appreciation for FLC's strong worship attendance in December and generous giving to the General Fund.
- * Approved an adjusted 2024 budget for the congregation's consideration at the annual meeting.
- Nominated candidates for election at the annual meeting to serve on several committees: Audit, Endowment, First Lutheran Fund and the Church Council.
- ★ Learned that...
 - New Lighting was installed in the library and kitchen, and that installation to the hallways was delayed due to a supplier error.
 - 55 Nativity Sets were given to FLC families with children aged 4 through 6th grade.
 - Bids for the kitchen update funded by the Caring Hearts and Hands appeal would soon be evaluated.
 - Jason Ehle and his family did a wonderful job of clearing the snow off of FLC's parking lots, sidewalks and landings during several snowstorms.
 - The organ's failed **electric control system** and auxiliary units were transported to the Peterson Company in Illinois. Technicians will replace that system and conduct several tests to insure that everything is in working order. Then, the new system will be installed in the organ.




Monday Zoom Faith Conversations

Caring for Creation and Self Discipline

In mid-January, we resumed our creation care Bible study. One discussion question that particularly stood out to me from our first session of the new year is as follows:

Jesus teaches that the way we spend our resources serves as a reflection of our heart. God sees out true motivations. He knows that if our hearts are focused on storing treasures in heaven, we won't worry about the things we "want" on this earth. When we properly use the resources God has given us, we'll be more concerned with loving Him, loving His creation, and loving our neighbors instead of our own comfort on earth – and we'll lead both spiritual and environmentally sustainable lives. Right now, today, you are an investor. Where are you investing? How do your spending habits reveal the priorities of your heart? (Excerpt from Serving God, Saving the Planet Guidebook by J. Matthew Sleeth, M.D.)

The season of Lent will soon begin, and it is often a period when we intentionally choose to give something up (or add something additional) to practice self-discipline and help us remember/focus on Jesus' sacrifice. As you reflect on the questions from the Bible study excerpt and the upcoming Lenten season, I challenge you to also consider how your care for creation may be improved. You may even find a new, more environmentally friendly habit is formed in the process!

A few examples to get you thinking about possible things to give up: plastic wrap (use re-usable containers), take-out containers (bring your own), disposable cups (only purchase from places that allow bring your own), plastic water bottles (refill a reusable one), "fast" food (think of all the trash saved). As for me, I plan to give up take-out containers, which are often not reusable, recyclable, or readily compostable. I know this will be a personal challenge that will require self-discipline.


