A Word from the Pastor

"So, what do I do now?"

After Jesus is placed in the tomb, the disciples decided to go into hiding. They worried that others would say they were Jesus' followers and thus were afraid they might get crucified too.



Imagine being one of them and wondering what to do next. When will it be safe to walk the streets again? What would Jesus want them to do now that he was gone? Should they just go back to fishing or some other job since there was nothing better to do? How would their families react after all of the drama in Jerusalem and in Golgotha, the place where Jesus was crucified?

They had a couple of days to think about it all. Talk about being between a rock and a hard place! They seemingly had lost everything. Danger lurked everywhere. Hope was replaced by fear and trepidation.

Then.....SURPRISE!!

Everything was turned upside down. The tomb was empty. They heard someone had actually talked with Jesus. How could that be? Was it OK to hope for something that is unbelievable?



What did they do next? Some doubted. Others believed. Thomas was not persuaded. Neither were the ancient Jews or Romans. If we were in their shoes, what would we have thought?

For Christians, Easter is the highest Sunday of the year. It is also the prime event that serves as the cornerstone of our faith. But there is more.

The disciples' lives were changed forever due to Jesus' resurrection. They needed to adapt to a new way of serving. After Jesus' ascension, they graduated from being pupils to becoming apostles, ambassadors for the faith.

How about us? What does Easter mean for our lives? It's not about just one day. How does the celebration of the resurrection influence our lives?

Perhaps these are important questions we should always be asking!

Council Highlights


At its March meeting, the Council:

- Approved a proposal from Noah Steinmetz to > do a project at FLC and earn an Eagle Award as a Boy Scout. (Only 4% of Boy Scouts earn such an honor.)
- Approved a recommendation from the Administration Committee to restructure some of FLC's Dedicated Funds to make reports easier to read and access.
- > Approved a recommendation from the leaders of the kitchen remodeling project. This project was approved. The remodeling will take place during the summer. Caring Hearts and Hands gifts will fund this appeal.



Learned that the Administration Committee > approved two facility requests for dates in May related to Syttende Mai.

- Learned that the **electrical update project** for > the parsonage will likely take place in April.
- Learned from Pastor Sara how the preaching > schedule will be adjusted while Pastor Lehman is on sabbatical.


We will begin a new study called *Romans: Good News that Changes Everything* by Melissa Spoelstra.

Selah Book Club




