

## Stewardship of God's Creation

Focusing on What's Necessary ~ Kendra Eppler

With very few exceptions, I am not a sports person. But, I haven't been able to let this tag line go since hearing it in the super bowl ads (while I was working on a puzzle, not even watching):



Shop like a billionaire.

Do you remember it, and what entity used it? Even more so, what did it mean to you?

I found it really irritating, which wasn't helped by the frequency that it was advertised. Why? Because of my interpretation. To me, it was selling consumerism, particularly the desire and perceived need to buy things that are not really needed. It seemed to me to be selling the idea that we can have and be like people considered wealthy, who can purchase whatever they want whenever they want. It certainly isn't the only ad to do this, and its message may actually be more direct than many others. Maybe that is why I found it so irritating.

So, what's the connection to creation care? How we choose to spend our money influences what and how products are made. That includes what products are produced, whether they use recycled materials, if they can be reused, recycled, or composted, etc. Remember this slogan: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle? Reduce is first because it produces the least amount of waste, and decreasing waste is one of the ways we care for creation. One resulting interpretation: Don't buy what isn't necessary.

I encourage you to be alert to how ads or other information may be trying to influence your purchases. For example, pay attention to why TV or print ads indicate you need what they are selling, as well as what emotions they are trying to invoke. "Don't buy what isn't necessary" may not be a realistically instantaneous shift for many of us, but it's a goal worthy of consideration and stepping toward.


#### **SCUBA VBS Coming to FLC!**
